Welcome back and into 2015!.. Hopefully, a lot of the new-building stress is now fading into a normal routine, and we can all breathe a bit easier. To all who have helped us get to this point and continue to partner with us to help provide all the services our children deserve, THANK YOU! If you cannot count yourself in this category, the new year is a great time to start. The children need you!

With the new year, inevitably comes the cold weather with all its challenges.
We expect our students to go outside daily

unless it is raining or unless the ground is too wet/muddy. This, of course, requires that they arrive appropriately dressed for the weather.

The flu has reached epidemic proportions in North Carolina. Contagions of all kinds are a great concern for schools. Having a sickness is bad enough, but sharing it is worse. As a reminder, the school's policy is that a sick child must be fever free for 24 hours before returning to school. Along with sickness, we generally see cases of lice returning with students. The policy on lice is that a child must not return until he or she has been successfully treated. (For more details on the sickness policy, please see the handbook section of your child's agenda.) Of particular concern for us is the safety of pregnant teachers and parents, as well as students with low immune systems from ongoing medical problems and those recovering from recent sicknesses.

Another safety issue recently came to our attention from a nurse. She advised us that students' reusable water bottles should be washed daily and allowed to completely dry to help contain the spread of bacteria. As a follow up, here is a site about reusable bottle cleaning.

Please help us keep all our children, staff, and parent volunteers as safe as possible from contagious sicknesses at school.
