For some of you, that seems like an eternity away, but it will be here before you know it. We also ask that your child be ready to exit as soon as the car stops to avoid holding up those behind you. Please also avoid having your child enter the car on the driving lane side; this is also a serious safety issue. The only new issue I have seen is a few people have decided to avoid the approved route around the parking lot, and are, instead, pulling in at the first left turn in front of the building, hoping to save time by jumping in front of the cars following the approved pattern. I don't think any parent is in a bigger hurry than any other parent — certainly not enough to incur the ire of those that see you bypass them.

Finally, in a new building, we have discovered that everything outside of the academic program must be refigured. What were rote procedures in the old facility do not work here. As an example, something as simple as a fire drill took us hours to plan the safest, quickest exit and meeting places. On top of that, we had to create a plan for our children with medical conditions that


