Foundation Board Update: (~5 min)

- The first meeting of the Foundation Board for the 2019-2020 school year is tentatively scheduled to take place on August 19.

- In addition to the above-listed members, the Foundation Board bylaws requires attendance by a PAWS member.
- Over the summer, the Foundation funded (\$400) and installed a concrete pad below the water fountain purchased via the 8th Grade class gift. Applicable Building Code required installation of the concrete pad, and the Foundation saved the School nearly \$1,600 by self-installing both the pad and fountain.

PAWS Update: (~5 min)

Mary Beth Roberson

- Over the summer, PAWS completed a major update of the teachers' lounge, purchasing a
 new table, coffee pot, jars, etc., and commissioning a new tile backsplash. Don Rice
 installed the backsplash for free and the PAWS Hospitality Committee stocked the
 lounge with coffees and creamers. The teachers were very impressed and appreciative of
 the result.
- PAWS hosted the annual kick-off Teacher Luncheon on the last teacher workday of the summer. The theme for this year's teacher luncheons is "Around the World," and each luncheon will feature a different culture and cuisine.
- PAWS received feedback last year that teacher appreciation week was too long and teachers would prefer the "appreciation" events to be spread throughout the year. Accordingly, PAWS will host one teacher appreciation day per quarter this year.
- Lend a PAW took place July 28th, and the volunteer group completed 20 different tasks around the School, including assembling and painting furniture, cleaning, etc. in preparation for the new school year.
- Volunteer lunch sign-up is underway. This year, all volunteers will be entered in a drawing for 11th spot in carpool.
- 100 people attended the Kindergarten back to school social.
- PAWS will sponsor a social at Mod Pizza on September 17th, which is an early release day. Mod Pizza will donate a portion of the proceeds from all lunch and dinner orders that day.
- Café Days orders closed on Sunday, August 4th, and lunches will be served starting on Monday, August 12th.
- Several PAWS and staff members will attend the Cultural Arts Booking Fair at Wakefield High School this Saturday, August 10th. More than 80 performers are scheduled to be present, and the group will select performers and dates for the upcoming school year.

- Academic Clubs starting this quarter are Chess and Yearbook, next quarter adding Middle School United Nations, Chorus, and Math Counts (Thanks to PAWS for funding support!)
- Separate recess for all grades has started. Still getting equipment set up for lower field. Some concerns about rain and different surfaces.
- Began with an Opening Ceremony for grades 3-5 and 6-8. Highlights included info about Positivity Project traits for the quarter, a person who embodies those traits, and a bullying presentation from Mrs. White.
- The new water fountain is a hit. It is on the playground and was a gift from last year's graduates.
- Presentation of 2019-2020 goals, which are attached to these Minutes as Exhibit A.
- Update on the School's use of mClass and iStation. In an effort to obtain and maintain the most accurate available data, Kindergarten will continue with mClass for the first quarter, while 1st 2nd and 3rd grades will move to iStation.

Additional Items:

• Announcement of Strategic Growth Plan

- After reviewing feedback from a variety of groups within the School, including parent survey results, student council, PAWS, and other stakeholder groups, the School community appears to be united in a desire for more comprehensive class offerings and additional facilities for student while avoiding any meaningful class size increase.
- To address all of these goals, the Board is beginning to take proactive steps to assess how we can address these priorities and enhance the school, including by potentially adding:
 - New middle school building;
 - Gym; and
 - Other facilities to be determined.

- o The Board has set an aggressive timeline of opening new facilities at the start of the 2022-2023 school year.
- The Board is still in the very beginning stages of consulting with experts to see what is possible, so the timeline and scope of work may very well change as we learn more.
- The Board welcomes and needs input and help from our community as we push forward these ambitious goals.
- Bill Kroll and Christi Whiteside recognized Lara Rice for her tireless work over the summer to get our enrollment numbers to full capacity.
- Bill Kroll announced that the McGuireWoods law firm will host its annual Non-Profit seminar on October 8th. The seminar touches a number of topics relevant to the School from a legal perspective. Bill and Tracy plan to attend and invite others to do the same. The event is free to the public.
